## **RECOGNIZING FALSE PROPHETS**


2 John 7... "For many deceivers have gone out into the world who do not confess Jesus Christ as coming in the flesh. This is a deceiver and an antichrist." (Message 2 0f 4) CHRISTatTheHelm.org

Deceivers use religion, education, traditions or whatever else and have one thing in common; they deny Christ as God and man, and His sacrifice as the only way to God. That's why the apostle John said, "For many deceivers have gone out into the world who do not confess Jesus Christ *as* coming in the flesh. This is a deceiver and an antichrist." (2 John 7)

Paul added this deception in 2Cor 11:13: "For such *are* false apostles, deceitful workers, transforming themselves into apostles of Christ." In essence, there are those who openly deny Christ as the only way to God, as well there are those who profess to believe in Christ as such, yet their hearts and actions are in complete opposition to the teachings of Christ. That's why Paul in Rom 16:18 said, "For those who are such do not serve our Lord Jesus Christ, but their own belly, and by smooth words and flattering speech deceive the hearts of the simple."

So, how do we recognize false prophets? The first test is obviously, do their teachings, ideologies, philosophies or even commandments line up with the Word of God? Then, as for those who do profess to believe in Christ, do their preaching and life cater to the flesh, material prosperity and pride of life?

Rev 21:8 gives us a clear picture of what will happen to such liars and deceivers this way: "But the cowardly, unbelieving, abominable, murderers, sexually immoral, sorcerers, idolaters, and all liars shall have their part in the lake which burns with fire and brimstone, which is the second death."

This scripture leaves no doubt as to the seriousness we should give to both avail ourselves in the knowledge of God's Word, and as importantly live as the Word of God teaches us.
