"So then faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the Word of God." Romans 10:17

The first fundamental principle of salvation by faith implies we must hear and receive the Word of God.

Here's how scripture testifies to this:

Acts 22:14: "The God of our ancestors has chosen you to know his will and to see the Righteous One and to hear words from his mouth."

Romans 15:4: "For everything that was written in the past was written to teach us, so that through the endurance taught in the Scriptures and the encouragement they provide we might have hope."

What then should the attitude of our heart be?

Hebrews 3:15: "Today, if you will hear His voice, do not harden your hearts."

James 1:21: "So get rid of all the filth and evil in your lives, and humbly accept the Word God has planted in your hearts, for it has the power to save your souls."


Why?

Hebrews 4:12: "For the Word of God *is* living and powerful, and sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing even to the division of soul and spirit, and of joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart."

Rev 3:20: "Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears My voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and dine with him, and he with Me."

John 8:47: "He who is of God hears God's words."

Is the door to my heart always open to receive the Word of God?



A very important element of salvation is that we must recognize that we are sinners and need to be forgiven. Unless we are so convicted, we won't have a change of heart and repent.

The reason Jesus declared in John 16:8 to His disciples, about sending the Holy Spirit after His departure: "And when He has come, He will convict the world of sin, and of righteousness, and of judgment."

In other words, in receiving the Word of God, people are convicted of sin through the Holy Spirit.

What does the conviction of sin produce in a person's heart?

2Cor. 7:10: "For godly sorrow produces repentance *leading* to salvation."


What happens when one rejects the conviction of sin?

1John 1:8: "If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us."

Romans 1:18: "For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who suppress the truth in unrighteousness."

Romans 2:5: "But because of your stubbornness and your unrepentant heart, you are storing up wrath against yourself for the day of God's wrath, when his righteous judgment will be revealed."

Do I recognize that I am a sinner, and have I repented and confessed my sins so as to receive God's forgiveness through Christ?



How did Jesus define what true faith in God is?

John 5:24: "Most assuredly, I say to you, he who hears My Word and believes in Him who sent Me has everlasting life, and shall not come into judgment, but has passed from death into life."

Why?

Hebrews 11:6: "It is impossible to please God without faith. Anyone who wants to come to him must believe that God exists and that He rewards those who sincerely seek him."

The purpose being:

2Timothy 1:9: "He has saved us and called us to a holy life, not because of anything we have done but because of his own purpose and grace. This grace was given us in Christ Jesus before the beginning of time."

Ephesians 1:13: "In him you also, when you heard the Word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and believed in Him, were sealed with the promised Holy Spirit."

Ephesians 2:8: "For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith; and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God."

Therefore:

Mark 16:16: "He who believes and is baptized will be saved; but he who does not believe will be condemned."

Hebrews 4:16: "Let us therefore come boldly to the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy and find grace."

Do I understand that genuine faith is much more than a simple acknowledgement of the truth?

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"Repent therefore and be converted, that your sins may be blotted out, so that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord." Acts 3:19

Repentance means that we regret and are sorrowful of our sins, which then produces a change of heart and mind to reject sin, and live to follow Christ.

Why is true repentance a necessary component leading to salvation? 2Cor. 7:10: "For godly grief produces a repentance that leads to salvation without regret, whereas worldly grief produces death."

Pro 28:13: "He who covers his sins will not prosper, but whoever confesses and forsakes *them* will have mercy."

2Peter 3:9: "The Lord is not slack concerning *His* promise, as some count slackness, but is longsuffering toward us, not willing that any should perish but that all should come to repentance."

2Chron. 7:14: "If My people who are called by My name will humble themselves, and pray and seek My face, and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin and heal their land."

1John 1:9: "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us *our* sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness."

Therefore:

Mat. 4:17: "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."

Having heard the message of salvation from the Word of God, have I been convicted of sin, truly believed in Christ, and repented of my sins?

"Then He said to them all, "If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow Me." Luke 9:23

How does the Word of God teach us that we must surrender our lives to follow Christ?

Matthew 7:21: "Not everyone who says to Me, 'Lord, Lord,' shall enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of My Father in heaven."

Luke 14:33: "Whoever of you does not forsake all that he has cannot be My disciple."

John 15:1-2: "I am the true vine, and My Father is the vinedresser. Every branch in Me that does not bear fruit He takes away; and every *branch* that bears fruit He prunes, that it may bear more fruit."

How must we follow Christ daily?


Romans 12:2: "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect."

Philippians 2:5-7: "Let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus, who, being in the form of God, did not consider it robbery to be equal with God, but made Himself of no reputation, taking the form of a bondservant, *and* coming in the likeness of men."

Why?

Galatians 5:24: "Those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires."

Am I truly surrendered to Christ, or does my heart still float in and with the world?



Why must we, as true believers, confess Christ as Savior and Lord? Philippians 2:9-11: "Therefore God also has highly exalted Him and given Him the name which is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of those in heaven, and of those on earth, and of those under the earth, and *that* every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ *is* Lord, to the glory of God the Father."

1John 4:2: "By this you know the Spirit of God: Every spirit that confesses that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is of God."

1John 4:15: "Whoever confesses that Jesus is the Son of God, God abides in him, and he in God."

Romans 10:10: "For with the heart one believes unto righteousness, and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation."

The reason Paul said in 1Timothy 6:12: "Fight the good fight of faith, lay hold on eternal life, to which you were also called and have confessed the good confession in the presence of many witnesses." Therefore:

1John 2:23: "Whoever denies the Son does not have the Father; the one who confesses the Son has the Father also."

From the testimony of my life and confession of faith, do my family, my friends, my neighbors and even my co-workers know that Christ is Lord of my life?

"So in Christ Jesus you are all children of God through faith, for all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ." Galatians 3:26-27

Why is water baptism an integral part of salvation?

John 3:5: "Jesus answered, "Most assuredly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God." Acts 2:38: "Then Peter said to them, "Repent, and let every one of you

be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit."

Why?


Romans 6:3: "Do you not know that as many of us as were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death?"

Acts 22:15-16: "For you will be His witness to all men of what you have seen and heard. And now why are you waiting? Arise and be baptized, and wash away your sins, calling on the name of the Lord."

1Peter 3:21: "Baptism, which corresponds to this, now saves you, not as a removal of dirt from the body but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ."

The reason Jesus enjoined us in Mark 16:15-16: "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature. He who believes and is baptized will be saved; but he who does not believe will be condemned."

Do I understand that water baptism is not a mere ceremony, but rather an integral part of our willful confession of faith in Christ as Savior and Lord?



How does the Word of God define the justification received through faith in Christ?

Romans 8:1: "*There is* therefore now no condemnation to those who are in Christ Jesus, who do not walk according to the flesh, but according to the Spirit."

2Corinthians 5:21: "For He made Him who knew no sin *to be* sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him."

Galatians 3:24: "So the law was our guardian until Christ came that we might be justified by faith."

Romans 5:9: "Much more then, having now been justified by His blood, we shall be saved from wrath through Him."


Romans 8:30: "Moreover whom He predestined, these He also called; whom He called, these He also justified; and whom He justified, these He also glorified."

The purpose being:

John 5:24: "Most assuredly, I say to you, he who hears My Word and believes in Him who sent Me has everlasting life, and shall not come into judgment, but has passed from death into life."

Titus 3:7: "That having been justified by His grace we should become heirs according to the hope of eternal life."

Do I understand that true faith in Christ, and as a result living to follow Him, is our only source of justification?



As born again believers and followers of Christ, the Holy Spirit indwells us, to guide and inspire us to newness of life.

How does the Word of God declare this?

Gal. 2:20: "I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the *life* which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me."

Titus 2:11-13: "For the grace of God that brings salvation has appeared to all men, teaching us that, denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly, righteously, and godly in the present age, looking for the blessed hope and glorious appearing of our great God and Savior Jesus Christ."


Rom 6:3-4: "Do you not know that as many of us as were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death? Therefore we were buried with Him through baptism into death, that just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life."

The reason why:

Rom 6:1-2: "Shall we continue in sin that grace may abound? Certainly not! How shall we who died to sin live any longer in it?"

1John 2:6: "He who says he abides in Him ought himself also to walk just as He walked."

Is my heart focused on the new life in Christ, and am I committed to follow Him?



What is it that Christ desires and requires from true believers in salvation?

John 15:16: "You did not choose Me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit, and *that* your fruit should remain, that whatever you ask the Father in My name He may give you."

How is that accomplished?

Colossians 3:1: "If then you were raised with Christ, seek those things which are above, where Christ is, sitting at the right hand of God."

2Peter 3:18: "Grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ."

Galatians 5:16: "Walk in the Spirit, and you shall not fulfill the lust of the flesh."

1Thessalonians 4:3-5: "It is God's will that you should be sanctified: that you should avoid sexual immorality; that each of you should learn to control your own body in a way that is holy and honorable, not in passionate lust like the pagans, who do not know God."

Colossians 3:5: "Therefore put to death your members which are on the earth: fornication, uncleanness, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry."

Finally, Jesus' words in John 15:5: "I am the vine, you *are* the branches. He who abides in Me, and I in him, bears much fruit; for without Me you can do nothing."

How much fruit do I bear for Christ right now?

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
