Here's what scripture says about obedience to God:

Deuteronomy 11:1: "You shall love the LORD your God, and keep His charge, His statutes, His judgments, and His commandments always."

Leviticus 22:31: "You shall keep My commandments, and perform them: I *am* the LORD."


Ezekiel 20:19: "I am the LORD your God; follow My decrees and be careful to keep My laws."

Proverbs 4:20-21: "My son, pay attention to what I say; turn your ear to My words. Do not let them out of your sight, keep them within your heart."

Matthew 22:37: "Jesus said to him, you shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind." Why?

Ecclesiastes 12:13-14: "Fear God and keep his commandments, for this is the duty of all mankind. For God will bring every deed into judgment, including every hidden thing, whether it is good or evil."

Do I recognize the authority of God in my life to follow His commandments?



What is God's purpose and promises for those who obey Him? Deuteronomy 5:29: "Oh, that they had such a heart in them that they would fear Me and always keep all My commandments, that it might be well with them and with their children forever!"

Exodus 19:5: "Now therefore, if you will indeed obey My voice and keep My covenant, then you shall be a special treasure to Me above all people; for all the earth *is* Mine."

What can we therefore expect if we do follow Christ?

John 15:16: "You did not choose Me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit, and *that* your fruit should remain, that whatever you ask the Father in My name He may give you."

2 Peter 1:10-11: "Therefore, my brothers and sisters, make every effort to confirm your calling and election. For if you do these things, you will never stumble, and you will receive a rich welcome into the eternal kingdom of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ."


As such, speaking of Christ Paul said:

Hebrews 5:9: "And having been perfected, He became the author of eternal salvation to all who obey Him."

Therefore:

Psalm 112:1: "Blessed *is* the man *who* fears the LORD, who delights greatly in His commandments."

Do I understand the ultimate purpose for following Christ as Lord of my life?



In essence, to obey God's commandments in Christ is the proof of our commitment as true believers, in that Christ is now Lord of our lives and thereby the seal of our salvation.

Why?

John 14:23: "If anyone loves Me, he will keep My Word; and My Father will love him, and We will come to him and make Our home with him."

Romans 6:16: "Don't you know that when you offer yourselves to someone as obedient slaves, you are slaves of the one you obey, whether you are slaves to sin, which leads to death, or to obedience, which leads to righteousness?"

As such:

James 1:22: "Be doers of the Word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves."

James 2:26: "For as the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without works is dead also."

Matthew 6:24: "No one can serve two masters; for either he will hate the one and love the other, or else he will be loyal to the one and despise the other."

Therefore:

Matthew 7:21: "Not everyone who says to Me, 'Lord, Lord,' shall enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of My Father in heaven."

Do I understand my responsibility to obey and follow Christ as Lord, the one, only and genuine proof of my belief in Christ the Savior?



"I have not departed from the commands of His lips; I have treasured the words of His mouth more than my daily bread." Job 23:12

As to how we must obey God, Job definitely showed it through his actions, never giving in to whoever tried to draw him to error about God.

How then must we live to obey God in following Christ Jesus?

2 Corinthians 10:4-5: "The weapons of our warfare *are* not carnal but mighty in God for pulling down strongholds, casting down arguments and every high thing that exalts itself against the knowledge of God, bringing every thought into captivity to the obedience of Christ."

Therefore: 1 Peter 1:13-15: "

1 Peter 1:13-15: "Gird up the loins of your mind, be sober, and rest *your* hope fully upon the grace that is to be brought to you at the revelation of Jesus Christ; as obedient children, not conforming yourselves to the former lusts, *as* in your ignorance; but as He who called you *is* holy, you also be holy in all *your* conduct."


Romans 12:2: "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what *is* that good and acceptable and perfect will of God."

Romans 12:9: "Abhor what is evil. Cling to what is good."

As such Jesus said:

Luke 9:23: "If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow Me."

Do I understand that faith in Christ is only genuine, if I live to follow Him as Lord?



What better blessing is there than to know that as true believers in God and Christ, we will live forever in His presence in paradise, God's Kingdom.

Here's how scripture defines this:

John 14:21: "Whoever has My commands and keeps them is the one who loves Me. The one who loves Me will be loved by my Father, and I too will love them and show Myself to them."

John 14:23: "If anyone loves Me, he will keep My Word; and My Father will love him, and We will come to him and make Our home with him."


What's more?

Exodus 19:5: "If you will indeed obey My voice and keep My covenant, then you shall be a special treasure to Me above all people; for all the earth *is* Mine."

Luke 6:47-48: "Whoever comes to Me, and hears My sayings and does them, I will show you whom he is like: He is like a man building a house, who dug deep and laid the foundation on the rock. And when the flood arose, the stream beat vehemently against that house, and could not shake it, for it was founded on the rock." Therefore:

Revelation 2:7: "He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches. To him who overcomes I will give to eat from the tree of life, which is in the midst of the Paradise of God."

Is obedience to the Word of God the focus of my life?



Jesus made it clear that believing in Him as Savior, incorporated that we follow Him as Lord.

How does the Word of God address those who say they believe, yet their lives do not support their confession?

James 2:14: "What good is it, my brothers, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? Can that faith save him?"

In Jesus' own words:

Matthew 5:13: "You are the salt of the earth; but if the salt loses its flavor, how shall it be seasoned? It is then good for nothing but to be thrown out and trampled underfoot by men."

Luke 6:46: "Why do you call Me 'Lord, Lord,' and not do the things which I say?"

Matthew 7:21: "Not everyone who says to Me, 'Lord, Lord,' shall enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of My Father in heaven."

As such, we are warned:

Revelation 2:5: "Consider how far you have fallen! Repent and do the things you did at first. If you do not repent, I will come to you and remove your lampstand from its place."

What' more?

Revelation 3:15-16: "I know your works, that you are neither cold nor hot. I could wish you were cold or hot. So then, because you are lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I will vomit you out of My mouth."

Am I a true believer in Christ, committed to live by His Word, and follow Christ as Lord?
