

In John 1:14 he added: "And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth."



The solution: John 3:16: "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life."


Jesus further declared in John 14:6: "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me."

What happens when we are born again?


In John 10:28 Jesus said, "And I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish; neither shall anyone snatch them out of My hand."


