Psalms 19:1-2: “The heavens declare the glory of God; and the firmament shows His handiwork. Day unto day utters speech, and night unto night reveals knowledge.”

Romans 11:36: “For of Him and through Him and to Him *are* all things, to whom *be* glory forever.”

Psalms 63:3-4: “Because Your lovingkindness *is* better than life, my lips shall praise You. Thus I will bless You while I live; I will lift up my hands in Your name.”


What’s more?

Matthew 4:10: “For it is written, ‘You shall worship the LORD your God, and Him only you shall serve.’”

Psalms 99:9: “Exalt the LORD our God, and worship at His holy hill; for the LORD our God *is* holy.”

Isaiah 42:8: “I am the LORD; that is My name! I will not yield My glory to another or My praise to idols.”

Revelation 5:13: “And every creature which is in heaven and on the earth and under the earth and such as are in the sea, and all that are in them, I heard saying: “Blessing and honor and glory and power be to Him who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb, forever and ever!”

Here’s an example of true worship to God from the heart:


Hebrews 11:4: “By faith Abel brought God a better offering than Cain did. By faith he was commended as righteous, when God spoke well of his offerings. And by faith Abel still speaks, even though he is dead.”

Hebrews 4:13: “There is no creature hidden from His sight, but all things *are* naked and open to the eyes of Him to whom we *must give* account.”

How does the Word of God define true and sincere worship?

John 4:23: “But the hour is coming, and now is, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth; for the Father is seeking such to worship Him.”

How should that translate in our every day life?

Colossians 3:16-17: “Let the Word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom, teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord. And whatever you do in word or deed, *do* all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him.”

Romans 12:1: “Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God’s mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God, this is your true and proper worship.”

Colossians 3:23-24: “And whatever you do, do it heartily, as to the Lord and not to men, knowing that from the Lord you will receive the reward of the inheritance; for you serve the Lord Christ.”

1Corinthians 10:31: “Therefore, whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God.”

What’s more?

Matthew 5:16: “Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.”

The reason Jesus warned us in Mark 7:6-7: “Isaiah was right when he prophesied about you hypocrites; as it is written: ‘These people honor me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me. They worship me in vain; their teachings are merely human rules.’”
